FIRST READING: 1 Kings 19:15-16, 19-21

¹⁵⁻¹⁸God said, "Go back the way you came through the desert to Damascus. When you get there anoint Hazael; make him king over Aram. Then anoint Jehu son of Nimshi; make him king over Israel. Finally, anoint Elisha son of Shaphat from Abel Meholah to succeed you as prophet. ¹⁹ Elijah went straight out and found Elisha son of Shaphat in a field where there were twelve pairs of yoked oxen at work plowing; Elisha was in charge of the twelfth pair. Elijah went up to him and threw his cloak over him. ²⁰ Elisha deserted the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, "Please! Let me kiss my father and mother good-bye—then I'll follow you." "Go ahead," said Elijah, "but, mind you, don't forget what I've just done to you." ²¹ So Elisha left; he took his yoke of oxen and butchered them. ⁵¹⁻⁵⁴When it came close to the time for his Ascension, he gathered up his courage and steeled himself for the journey to Jerusalem. He sent messengers on ahead. They came to a Samaritan village to make arrangements for his hospitality. But when the Samaritans learned that his destination was Jerusalem, they refused hospitality. When the disciples James and John learned of it, they said, "Master, do you want us to call a bolt of lightning down out of the sky and incinerate them?" ⁵⁵⁻⁵⁶ Jesus turned on them: "Of course not!" And they traveled on to another village. ⁵⁷ On the road someone asked if he could go along. "I'll go with you, wherever," he said. ⁵⁸ Jesus was curt: "Are you ready to rough it? We're not staying in the best inns, you know." Jesus said to another, "Follow me." ⁵⁹ He said, "Certainly, but first excuse me for a couple of days, please. I have to make arrangements for my father's funeral."⁶⁰ Jesus refused. "First things first. Your business is life, not death. And life is urgent: Announce God's kingdom!" ⁶¹ Then another said, "I'm ready to follow you, Master, but first excuse me while I get things straightened out at home."⁶² Jesus said, "No procrastination.
