² Smoke, nothing but smoke. There's nothing to anything—it's all smoke. ¹²⁻¹⁴ Call me "the Quester." I've been king over Israel in Jerusalem. I looked most carefully into everything, searched out all that is done on this earth. And let me tell you, there's not much to write home about. God hasn't made it easy for us. I've seen it all and it's nothing but smoke—smoke, and spitting into the wind. ^{2:18-19} And I hated everything I'd accomplished and accumulated on this earth. I can't take it with me—no, I have to leave it to whoever comes after me. Whether they're worthy or worthless—and who's to tell?—they'll take over the earthly results of my intense thinking and hard work. Smoke. ²⁰⁻²³ That's when I called it quits, gave up on anything that could be hoped for on this earth. What's the point of working your fingers to the bone if you hand over what you worked for to someone who never lifted a finger for it? Smoke, that's what it is. A bad business from start to finish. So what do you get from a life of hard labor? Pain and grief from dawn to dusk. Never a decent night's rest. Nothing but smoke.

GOSPEL: Luke 12:13-21

¹³ Someone out of the crowd said, "Teacher, order my brother to give me a fair share of the family inheritance." ¹⁴ He replied, "Mister, what makes you think it's any of my business to be a judge or mediator for you?" ¹⁵ Speaking to the people, he went on, "Take care! Protect yourself against the least bit of greed. Life is not defined by what you have, even when you have a lot." ¹⁶⁻¹⁹ Then he told them this story: "The farm of a certain rich man produced a terrific crop. He talked to himself: 'What can I do? My barn isn't big enough for this harvest.' Then he said, 'Here's what I'll do: I'll tear down my barns and build bigger ones. Then I'll gather in all my grain and goods, and I'll say to myself, Self, you've done well! You've got it made and can now retire. Take it easy and have the time of your life!' ²⁰ Just

then God showed up and said, 'Fool! Tonight you die. And your barnful of goods—who gets it?' ²¹ That's what happens when you fill your barn with Self and not with God."
