How Far Would God Go for Us? Pastor Paula Geister-Jones

By the time you read this article the group going to the BWCA will have already driven the 500 miles up to the Outfitters at the end of the Gunflint Trail and returned. Why do we drive a total of 1000 miles to spend 6 days in the wilderness? What can I say, I really love the Boundary Waters. To me it is a holy place. It is good for my soul and I hope each year that the people who join me experience the place as holy as well. So the miles are not an issue. We usually stop at MacDonald's in Eau Claire for Breakfast, the harbor in Duluth for lunch and Ole and Sven's Pizza in Grand Marias and before you know it, we are driving that gravel road into Voyageur Outfitters.

If you think I can put the miles on without giving it a second thought, let me share a story about my two oldest children. A few years back, when Matt was going to college in Moorhead, Minnesota and Sophie was at Augustana in Sioux Falls, South Dakota Luke had a wrestling tournament at the Alliant Energy Center in Madison. Matt drove down to Sioux Falls – 244 miles – then the two drove to Madison, Wisconsin – 434 mile – a total of 678 miles – to watch Luke wrestle on a Saturday and the following day – Sunday – drove home. They put on 1356 miles that weekend just to be there for their little brother. They did not think twice of it. Matt and Sophie must love their little brother dearly if they were willing to drive that distance just to be there for him.

One of my favorite books to read to our children before bed when they were young was, "Guess How Much I Love You?" It is now labeled a "classic" written by Sam McBratney. In the book, Big Nutbrown Hare is putting little Nutbrown Hare to bed and they are sharing with one another just how much they love each other. One of Little Nutbrown's answers – just before he closes his eyes and falls asleep – is "I love you right up to the moon." Big Nutbrown Hare responds, "Oh, that is very far – very far." Then he kisses his Little Nutbrown Hare, who has closed his eyes, and says, "I love you to the moon and back." The moon is 238,855 miles away and to the moon and back is 447,710 miles. That is a lot of loving.

How much does God love us? God sent God's one and only Son to this earth because God loves us. How far is that? I have no idea. From here to the end of the universe? 93 billion light years. (googled it.) That is really-really far. That is how much God loves us. God created this earth with all its creatures and plants and God loves it. As the BWCA is holy to me, earth is holy to God. And it was God who got down on God's knees and molded us out of the dirt of the earth and breathed into us the breathe of life, so God loves each and every one of us. God would do anything for us and God did. God watched as God's only Son died on a cross so that we might live.

Baby Care Kits

TWO lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies ®)

TWO long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)

TWO receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, between 36" and 52" square

FOUR cloth diapers, flat fold preferred

ONE jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap

TWO pairs of socks

ONE hand towel, dark color recommended

TWO or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars

TWO diaper pins or large safety pins

Personal Care Kits

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

ONE adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging*

ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging *

Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

School Kits

FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper

ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

ONE pencil sharpener

ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band

ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons

ONE 2 1/2" eraser

ONE sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)





GO AND TELL BY ROGER SLACK



There are times in our lives when we get to see what God has done personally in our lives. This is one of my stories that I love to tell.

I was single and farming with my Dad and Brother since 1977. Around the fall of 1985, at the church I grew up in, I was at a weeknight Bible Study that the Lutheran Church had developed. I remember that it was pretty good and I enjoyed being with the people there as they were like family and close knit friends. One guy, that was in our small group, was a man named Tommy Bolstad. He and his wife's marriage were one of four couples that I had admired as I grew up in that church. They had so much fun together as well as those around them. After one of the studies, Tom said to me privately," "Man, you need to start praying for a wife". I think

me privately," "Man, you need to start praying for a wife". I think he felt like he had crossed the line, so he left it at that and I went home thinking "Maybe he's right". So I asked God to find me a wife. I had no more than said it when I thought, "What did I just do? I'm no more a husband than the Man on the Moon."

Farming had left me frustrated and I figured I never would get married if I stayed there, so I began making plans to sell out to my brother. I had a degree in agriculture, so I was going to go into the Peace Corp and help out somewhere that needed me. I thought maybe I would meet a nice girl to boot.

In the months prior to me actually going, I was still farming and one February morning I noticed a loose bolt on the drawbar hitch on my tractor. It was an awkward spot under the tractor in the snow and because my gloves were wet, I did not feel the wrench turn in my hand as it rotated and hit me on the tip of my front tooth. It didn't damage the front, but blew the enamel off the back side of the tooth. I remember being surprised that it didn't hurt, but I knew it was going to. I then remembered the dentist that I had gone to as a kid had had a heart attack and died the New Years eve before. I began calling 5 or 6 dentists and was not able to get in for 3 weeks. Finally I called another and he agreed to see me on an emergency basis. He told me I needed to have my teeth cleaned. I didn't tell him how long it had been.

That is when I met Geri. She had only worked for him for about a year and was new to the area with two little kids, so her social life was really limited as well. Her co-workers told her "Don't bother, he's too quiet". Thankfully she didn't listen and after one of the dental sessions I had to have to get ready for the Peace Corp, she told me to call her. That surprised me as she knew what my plans were. I never did go to the Peace Corp (Tunisia specifically) and four months later we were married. That was 39 years ago this month.

I still sit back in awe of all the little details that God had to work out in both of our lives just for our paths to cross. There really wasn't any reason why we would have ever met. Even in hard times, God still sees to the details. If we are looking, it is an awesome thing to look back and see what He has done. Please let me hear you favorite God moments/blessings.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY AND CONFIRMATION NEWS




It is that time of year again. Pastor Paula and I met a couple weeks ago to start planning for the 2025 –2026 Sunday School/Youth School year.

Because of early planning, we can already share two important dates in September. Rally Sunday will be the Sunday, September 14th. Rally Sunday is the start of our fall schedule which includes the Worship Lite Service: (Family Express service at 9:15 a.m. and Sunday school will begin in the Large Youth Room at 10:00 a.m. for all students) This is a change from last year where we met in the sanctuary.

They will be introduced to their teaching staff and welcomed by our entire staff before breaking up into their individual groups to get better acquainted with their fellow classmates and teachers. Friday, August 22nd


