GO AND TELL BY ROGER SLACK

This is about a visit I had recently with a 1st cousin of mine that her brother had let me know, her family had moved her into assisted living as her Dementia had progressed to the point they could not take care of her in her home. She is 84. It was a Sunday afternoon that I had nothing going on, so on the spur of the moment decided to make the trip up to Viroqua to see her as I hadn't seen her at the last family reunion. I had no idea of what to expect, if she would know me, if I would be interrupting her afternoon nap and she want me to go. I just didn't know. As it turned out, her daughter and granddaughter were also there visiting, so it was good and I'm glad they were. There were some comical moments as her granddaughter was adjusting her grandmother's hearing aids so she could better hear what we were talking about.

As I kind of expected, she knew I was a cousin, but asked me to tell her which one. We both laughed and then again twice more during the time I was there. Her short term memory had taken a hit from the disease, but as we talked, I began to realize she still had memories from the past she could draw from. I'm thankful her granddaughter was there as she provided questions and allowed me to explain the intertwining of the family trees of the Slacks, Kolstads and Gardners as there are some interesting branches that crossover. This was in my cousins realm of long term memories and allowed her to remember names and things that even I had forgotten. It was fun for all of us to witness her having a good afternoon. Her brother called me that evening, as he heard I had visited her and was glad she had a good day for me to remember her with. Apparently that isn't always the case. He also told me that she couldn't remember who it was that visited her, but she was going to get a guest register to have people sign and date so she can look at it to remember who and when people came to see her. Coming from her, I thought that was a great idea. "Why didn't we think of that." Lol!

If you ever find yourself in a similar situation, you might want to try directing the conversation to things from the past. This may be where their memories are the strongest and give them a chance to be a part of the conversation.

Hymn Nerds December




"O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" (Latin: "Veni, veni, Emmanuel") is a Christian hymn for Advent. The text was originally written in Latin and is a metrical paraphrase of the "O Antiphons", a series of plainchant antiphons or liturgical songs sung the final days before Christmas.

The hymn has its origins over 1,200 years ago in monastic life in the 8th or 9th century. Seven days before Christmas Eve monasteries would sing the "O antiphons" in anticipation of Christmas Eve. This makes this one of the oldest hymns we still sing today.

The 1851 translation by John Mason Neale is the most prominent in the English-speaking world and the one that was first combined with the tune called "Veni Emmanuel" This is the version we use each year in this congregation.



Mission Trip 2026 Youth 8th Grade - Adults Alaska – South of Anchorage Friday, June 19 – Sunday, June 28

Breakdown of Cost...

\$1,000 for flight to Anchorage. Group rates are always about \$200 more than for an individual.

\$800 for six nights of lodging and food. (We will sleep in a church on the floor with air mattresses.)

\$300 for two adventures – hiking a Glacier, kayaking in the ocean, etc. We will decide as a group which adventures interest us the most.

\$200 – van rental and gas per person

\$200 – additional food and lodging

DO NOT LET THE COST SCARE YOU. There are numerous opportunities in the coming year to bring your cost down a big chunk (Mail Order Bake Sale, Garage Sale, Lenten Luncheons, etc.) and we have some extra funds in the youth account for people who work hard to help raise the funds and there are people in the congregation who will help you pay for your trip.

We are just beginning to work out the details of the trip, I have talked to Justin, our mission trip consultant with Praying Pelican. For the next 6 months we will be in conversation discussing possibilities.

What do I know? I have told Justin we would like a mission trip that gives the group a variety of work to do because we will be bringing a group of people with a variety of gifts. So we discussed children's ministry, repair work, building, food pantry, soup kitchen, etc. We are expected at the sight between 2 and 5 p.m. on Saturday, June 20. If we catch the flight from Madison to Anchorage on Friday, June 19th we will have time to explore the city. Hopefully we will have the energy. We leave from Madison at 6:00 a.m. and arrive at 11:30 a.m. but have actually been traveling for 8 ½ hours (1 ½ hour layover in Minneapolis). We leave our sight on Friday, so we have Saturday to add another adventure to our trip. How many times are you going to go to Alaska. We need to do this.

Boundary Waters Canoe Trip 2026 Monday, July 20 – July 26 Youth in Grades 7-12 and ALL INTERESTED ADULTS Cost: \$500 \$450 after \$50 campership

The trip is in late July. We will be home before football starts.

As always, to keep our costs down, we pack out our own food and tents and provide as many of our own Duluth packs as possible. We have 15. The Outfitter provides the canoes, paddles, life jackets, a few Duluth packs, bunkhouse accommodations for Monday, July 20, breakfast the following morning and a shower when we come off trails.

We leave early Monday, July 20. By early I mean at 6:00 a.m. That means you need to be at the church by 5:30 a.m. to pack. Why so early? We have 500 miles to travel. Bring food to snack on in the vehicles. We stop at Duluth harbor for lunch. Bring a packed lunch if you like, but food MAY be purchased there. We arrive in Grand Marais around 4:00 p.m. We hang out for a while and have pizza at Ole and Lena' around 5:30 p.m. After eating we finish the trip up the Gunflint to Voyageur Outfitters. The cost of that meal is part of the trip.

What do you do in the Boundary Waters? You paddle, portage, cook your meals over an open fire, swim, fish, enjoy the wilderness and the people you are with. Bring a book to read and some small portable games. We come off the water between 7 - 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, shower, pack up and leave for home. The cost of the trip also covers breakfast/lunch at the Mid Trail Cafe about 30 miles south of the Outfitters on the way home. We usually arrive home about 10:00 p.m. For youth who can drive, parents may want to leave a car in the church parking lot. Once you have signed up, we will share with you a list of items that you will need to pack.

Elizabeth Circle News

After our October meeting we contacted Pastor Kristin Engstrom regarding her safety because the news told us of ongoing protests in Madagascar. The following is her reply:

I can assure you that I am 100% safe. The protests have finished and the transitional government has gone to work to reform many of the problems and unhelpful government systems in Madagacascar. We did have about 2 weeks of protests, especially by the young adults, that led up to the transition in government and the previous president fleeing the country. They were well coordinated and announced where they were going to protest ahead of time, so I mostly stayed home or ventured out when necessary on days they

said there would be a pause in protesting.

One thing that was interesting is that the foreign press (BBC, US stations, etc) made the situation look more frightening than reality, especially by calling the transition a "military coup." When in reality, the president and his big supporters fled the country when they couldn't use force to stop the protests, and then some military leaders stepped up to lead, and ther leadership then received a vote of support from the legislature and the Supreme Court.

The "reformation" president, as he is calling himself, is a faithful Lutheran leader. He is said to be honest, stong, a good listener, and wise. Please keep him and the additional new leaders of Madagascar in your prayer.

I am actually currently travelling in Nigeria, which may also bring fear given Pres. Trump's recent tweets about Nigeria. Two days ago we visited some communities that are experiencing the violence Trump tweeted about, though it is more nuanced than his tweet would make you believe. (It seems the conflict is more about land - one ethnic group who are predominately Muslim and nomadic herdsman, want to live on and have control of the land lived on by another ethnic group who are farmers and primarily Christian.)

The stories are horrific and people and leaders are living with great burdens. The ELCA is working through a partner organization to provide short-term and economic development relief. Please also keep the local traditional leaders and local government leaders of north-eastern / north-central Nigeria in your prayers, as they are the primary people trying to respond to a very difficult situation.
