“Love, Love, Love”

The 14th of February is Valentine’s Day. I loved Valentine’s Day as a child in grade school. It meant a party at the end of the day and Valentine cards with CANDY. What child doesn’t love that? I grew up believing that Valentine’s Day is all about CANDY and cards and flowers. You give them to your classmates and the people you care about.

Then I grew up I learned about the origin of the holiday. I discovered there is more to it than CANDY. There are a few Christian martyrs with the name “Valentine” but the day was probably dedicated to Saint Valentine, a 3rd century priest. He defied Emperor Claudius II by secretly marrying soldiers. A soldier lived to fight – not love. It didn’t matter if you were a priest. You didn’t defy Rome. He was executed on February 14th. If I remember right, he was beheaded.

We sang a song in Worship Express a few weeks ago that is all about “love.” It’s been around for some time. Many of us sang it years ago in Vacation Bible School. It is a hard song to forget. Its tune is simple and catchy.

*Love, love, love
That's what it's all about.
'Cause God loves us we love each other
Mother, Father, Sister, Brother
Everybody sing and shout!
'Cause that's what it's all about.
It's about love, love, love."*

The song tells us Christians that like Valentine, and like our Lord and Savior, we are to be about “love.” Valentine gave his life for the soldiers and their sweethearts. Jesus loved us and the world so much he gave his life. And we are to be just as committed to the same kind of selfless, unconditional love of others whether or not we know them or they deserve it. That is called “agape love” among Christians. I don’t know if I can do that, but there is another song out there that speaks to our time, “What the World Needs Now.”

*“What the world needs now is love, sweet love,
it's the only thing that there's just too little of;
What the world needs now is love, sweet love,
no, not just for some, but for everyone”.*


New Member Orientation will be on **Sunday, February 22** and on **March 1**

GO AND TELL BY ROGER SLACK

At the end of the first chapter of John's Gospel is the story of Phillip inviting Nathanael to come and see Jesus of Nazareth. I had read this rather short story before, and remember being somewhat confused about the reactions of both Jesus and Nathanael to each other.

Nathanael shows a little cynicism within himself when he lets Phillip know his opinion of Nazareth (Can anything good come out of Nazareth?) I generally find that cynicism and frustration walk hand and hand in the people I've known. When they meet, Jesus comments "Behold an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no guile." (no deceit or deception, innocent). My guess is he would say what he was thinking so you didn't have to wonder about what he meant. Jesus' statement surprises him as he knew they had never even met before. How can he know anything about me? When Jesus says He saw him under the fig tree, it initially struck me as a rather odd response and then just as odd, Nathanael's response to Jesus. That Jesus saw him under the fig tree would make him declare that Jesus was the Son of God.

Something pretty significant had to have taken place under that fig tree for Jesus to bring it up and Nathanael to respond like that. As far as I know there were no ceremonies for the Jews that would have been done under a fig tree. My guess is that the significance of the fig tree was that it was in a very remote place and Nathanael could see and know that he was alone with no one else around. If he was frustrated, whether within his life or possibly with the Jewish leaders of the day, I think he probably poured out his heart to God there, honestly asking God to give him some answers and help him make sense of the things that were bothering him. The thing was, the only ones that knew what took place would have been himself and God. For Jesus to say, "I saw you under the fig tree", would probably have taken the breath right out of him. Only God knew Nathanael was there. This has to be the Son of God and God's answer to his prayer.

Maybe there is a better explanation than what I can imagine took place, but the most important thing was the impact Jesus had on cynical Nathanael's life and his faith. Nathanael did become one of the twelve Apostles of Jesus, but is renamed Bartholemew, just as Simon became Peter and later on Saul became Paul. There was a definite change in Nathanael's life.



Boundary Waters Canoe Trip 2026

Monday, July 20 – July 26

Youth in Grades 7-12 and ALL INTERESTED ADULTS

Cost: \$500 \$450 after \$50 campership

The trip is in late July. We will be home before football starts.

As always, to keep our costs down, we pack out our own food and tents and provide as many of our own Duluth packs as possible. We have 15. The Outfitter provides the canoes, paddles, life jackets, a few Duluth packs, bunkhouse accommodations for Monday, July 20, breakfast the following morning and a shower when we come off trails.

We leave early Monday, July 20. By early I mean at 6:00 a.m. That means you need to be at the church by 5:30 a.m. to pack. Why so early? We have 500 miles to travel. Bring food to snack on in the vehicles. We stop at Duluth harbor for lunch. Bring a packed lunch if you like, but food MAY be purchased there. We arrive in Grand Marais around 4:00 p.m. We hang out for a while and have pizza at Ole and Lena's around 5:30 p.m. After eating we finish the trip up the Gunflint to Voyageur Outfitters. The cost of that meal is part of the trip.

What do you do in the Boundary Waters? You paddle, portage, cook your meals over an open fire, swim, fish, enjoy the wilderness and the people you are with. Bring a book to read and some small portable games. We come off the water between 7 - 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, shower, pack up and leave for home. The cost of the trip also covers breakfast/lunch at the Mid Trail Cafe about 30 miles south of the Outfitters on the way home. We usually arrive home about 10:00 p.m. For youth who can drive, parents may want to leave a car in the church parking lot. Once you have signed up, we will share with you a list of items that you will need to pack. **REGISTRATION FORMS ARE ON THE INFORMATION DESK**
