### Worship During Holy Week

This year I encourage you to attend worship on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Easter is so much more meaningful if you hear the story of Jesus' last meal with his disciples before his arrest. You will hear once again the story of Jesus' arrest, his questioning before the Sanhedrin and Pilate and his crucifixion. It is not a "fun" story or an "entertaining" story. It is a story that speaks of our world and our experiences and hearing those stories makes Easter something to truly celebrate.

#### Wednesday, April 1: Bread Baking

4<sup>th</sup> Graders gather in the church kitchen from 3:30 -5:00 p.m. to bake bread for Maundy Thursday and Easter Worship with Pastor Paula and Jenny Hoffman. Parents are welcome to attend.

#### Thursday, April 2: Maundy Thursday Worship with Holy Communion at 6:30 p.m.

Join Jesus and his disciples in the Cenacle "Upper Room" and share the Passover meal for the last time. 4<sup>th</sup> Graders and their parents will be there to celebrate their completion of First Communion Instruction. The bread used that night will be bread they baked the day before in the church kitchen. **Special Music:** Men's Choir and Karen Warwick on dulcimer.

#### Friday, April 3: Good Friday Worship at Noon and 6:30 p.m.

In case you're wondering about the girl, remember I said there was a flip side to the question. She married a guy from Wyoming, of all places. She was a lot of fun and between her and her sister could make anyone laugh. God knows what He is doing. I had a few more miles to go.

**Boundary Waters Canoe Trip 2026**  
**Monday, July 20 – July 26**  
**Youth in Grades 7-12 and ALL INTERESTED ADULTS**  
**Cost: \$500 \$450 after \$50 campership**

The trip is in late July. We will be home before football starts. As always, to keep our costs down, we pack out our own food and tents and provide as many of our own Duluth packs as possible. We have 15. The Outfitter provides the canoes, paddles, life jackets, a few Duluth packs, bunkhouse accommodations for Monday, July 20, breakfast the following morning and a shower when we come off trails.

We leave early Monday, July 20. By early I mean at 6:00 a.m. That means you need to be at the church by 5:30 a.m. to pack. Why so early? We have 500 miles to travel. Bring food to snack on in the vehicles. We stop at Duluth harbor for lunch. Bring a packed lunch if you like, but food MAY be purchased there. We arrive in Grand Marais around 4:00 p.m. We hang out for a while and have pizza at Ole and Lena's around 5:30 p.m. After eating we finish the trip up the Gunflint to Voyageur Outfitters. The cost of that meal is part of the trip.

What do you do in the Boundary Waters? You paddle, portage, cook your meals over an open fire, swim, fish, enjoy the wilderness and the people you are with. Bring a book to read and some small portable games. We come off the water between 7 - 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, shower, pack up and leave for home. The cost of the trip also covers breakfast/lunch at the Mid Trail Cafe about 30 miles south of the Outfitters on the way home. We usually arrive home about 10:00 p.m. For youth who can drive, parents may want to leave a car in the church parking lot. Once you have signed up, we will share with you a list of items that you will need to pack.

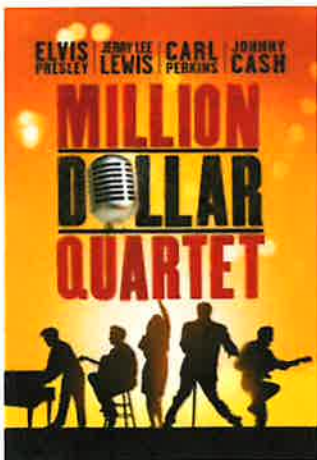

## April Hymn Nerds

The music for the hymn "Have No Fear Little Flock" was composed by Heinz Werner Zimmermann (1930 – 2022) in 1971. Zimmermann was a German composer, who focused on contemporary sacred music. He was professor of composition in Germany, and held several honorary doctorates from the Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, U.S. His music is influenced by American spirituals and jazz. The tune LITTLE FLOCK features the syncopations typical of his jazz-flavored church music. Zimmermann chose the words of Jesus from Luke 12:32 as his basis for writing stanza 1 and Marjorie A. Jillson wrote stanzas 2-4 in 1972 to complete hymn that we sing on April 26.
